Oxford German Olympiad 2026: Tasks and Guidelines Immer unterwegs - Mobilität und Reiselust

Note that the closing date for submissions is 12 noon, Thursday, 12 March 2026

Entries should be submitted via the online form at https://www.mod-langs.ox.ac.uk/mml apps/community/public/form?id=ogn-olympiad-2026. Please note that we cannot accept postal or email entries. Entries received by post, by email or after the deadline will not be considered. Any queries or questions should be directed to the Olympiad Coordinator at olympiad@mod-langs.ox.ac.uk.

BULK ENTRIES: **Teachers** who would like to enter student entries in bulk please contact olympiad@mod-langs.ox.ac.uk for instructions.

Please read the following guidelines <u>carefully</u> before entering the competition:

- 1. Entries must be submitted using the Online Entry Form. Please take care to specify on the Online Entry Form which task you are submitting an entry for (e.g. "Year 7-9, Task 1", "Discover German, Task 2", etc.). Entries submitted in the wrong category will not be considered!
- 2. Entries should be the work of the entrant(s) alone. Any additional assistance given by teachers or others should be noted in the space provided in the Online Entry Form and/or on the teacher form. Essays found to have been produced with AI tools will be disqualified. Entries which the judges consider were produced with the assistance of online tools will be disqualified.
- 3. All text included in the entries should be in <u>German</u> except where stated in the task instructions.
- 4. Entrants must be resident in the United Kingdom. All entrants must indicate how long they have been learning German and/or if they are native speakers of German.
- 5. Entrants may only enter as individuals. **Group entries will not be considered except for the "Open Competition for Groups" category**, which is open to **groups of 2-4**. Entries from groups of more than 4 will not be considered for the "Open Competition for Groups" category.
- 6. Entrants may only take part in <u>one</u> task within their age group as INDIVIDUAL entrants. They are permitted to submit an additional entry as part of a GROUP.



- 7. Where 2 or more entrants are entering as a GROUP, one nominated entrant should fill in the entry form. In the relevant box, the nominated entrant should list the first name and surname of each other member of the group. Please ensure you have permission to do so from your fellow group members. For entrants under 13, each group member will need to submit a Consent Form (see below or https://www.ogn.ox.ac.uk/files/parent_form.pdf). The nominated entrant is responsible for informing their fellow group members about any communications from the Oxford German Network, e.g. about results, invitation to the prizegiving, etc.
- 8. Unless specified otherwise, entries should be submitted in one of the following formats only:
- * Microsoft Word document
- * PDF
- * JPEG

Film entries should be uploaded to www.youtube.com and a copy of the link submitted via the online form. The link must be entered in the relevant box AND uploaded as a Word or PDF document (the document should only contain the link). Original work in the form of a website link should also be submitted via the online form in the relevant box AND uploaded as a Word or PDF document. Note that many schools have their own YouTube channel which you may be able to use. YouTube also allows you to set up a private channel so that the only people who can see your video are those to whom you have sent a link. Please ensure that the link is enabled for the Olympiad judging team to view it. Make sure you have discussed this with your parent(s)/guardian(s) and your teacher before you upload anything to the internet! You must also make sure that you do not upload any material that is subject to third-party copyright.

- 9. The judges will take account of academic level, creativity, linguistic accuracy, stylistic sophistication and where appropriate factual accuracy of the submission. **The decision of the judges is final and no correspondence will be entered into.**
- 10. **Every submission** must include a completed **Olympiad Teacher Form** (see below or https://www.ogn.ox.ac.uk/files/ogn-olympiad-teacher-form.pdf). If no teacher form can be supplied, please send an email to olympiad@mod-langs.ox.ac.uk with the subject line 'Olympiad Teacher Form' providing an explanation.
- 11. Entrants under the age of 13 (i.e. ages 9-12) must provide a **Consent Form** (see below or https://www.ogn.ox.ac.uk/files/parent_form.pdf). It must be signed by parents/guardians of entrants under 13, and a copy uploaded alongside the entrant's competition entry. Typed digital signatures will not be accepted. Submissions by entrants under 13 without a Consent Form cannot be considered.

The Competition Tasks

Choose <u>one</u> of the tasks appropriate for your age group. All tasks to be completed in German, unless indicated otherwise.

Years 5 and 6 (age 9-11)

- 1. Design your ideal *Transportmittel* (means of transport) and label 10-12 parts. (at least 10 labels, 1 side of A4).
- 2. Draw a map of your dream journey and 10-12 things you will need to put in your suitcase or rucksack. If you're taking a pet along, don't forget their needs. Labels those things. (at least 10 labels, 1 side of A4).
- 3. Draw a cartoon of someone encountering problems on a train journey, with speech bubbles. (at least 15 words, 1 side of A4).

Years 7 to 9 (age 11-14)

- 1. Create a comic strip about a journey undertaken by two or three animals. (100-200 words, 1-3 sides of A4).
- 2. "Fahrrad, Auto, Eisenbahn, Schiff, Flugzeug ... Welche Transportmittel werden wir im Jahr 2050 benutzen?" Write an essay or create a short video. Illustrate your response with drawings or photos. (100-200 words, 1-3 sides of A4 OR max. 4 minutes of video).
- 3. Write an essay or story on ONE of the following topics: "Meine Reise zum Mond" *OR* "Meine Traumreise" *OR* "Mein Schulweg". (100-200 words, 1-3 sides of A4).

Years 10 and 11 (age 14-16)

- 1. Develop a proposal in German for a video game entitled "Abenteuerreise", presenting it with drawings, photos or in video format. (max. 4 minutes or 200-250 words).
- 2. Write an essay on the invention, use and dangers of one or more of the following methods of travel: *Kanu, Seilbahn, Zeppelin, Rakete*. (2-3 sides of A4, 200 words).
- 3. Write a fictional travelogue including conversations from the perspective of a group of migrating birds. (200-250 words).

Years 12 and 13 (age 16-18)

- 1. Die Heldenreise or Hero's Journey is a common narrative framework that can be found in many stories, from old myths to today's novels and films. It outlines a hero's adventure through a special world, facing tests and coming home transformed with newfound wisdom or a reward. Write an abstract for a screenplay which follows or changes this pattern. (300-400 words).
- 2. "Alternatives Reisen" Create a conference brochure with keynote papers, workshops and activities. (must include 300-400 words).
- 3. "Eine unvergessliche Bahnreise!" Create a travel agent's advertisement in brochure or website format presenting two real train journeys in Germany, Austria or Switzerland. For each one, include three items of customer feedback. (300-400 words).

Open Competition for Groups (2-4 participants)

- 1. Create a video sketch entitled "Ich packe meinen Koffer...". (max. 4 minutes).
- 2. Record a podcast with the title "Reiselust in den Zeiten der Nachhaltigkeit". (max. 4 minutes).
- 3. Create a concept for a board game focusing on real or fantasy transport or travel, and present it as a brochure or in a video. (max. 4 minutes or 200-300 words).

Discover German - Taster Competition (individual participants with no prior experience of studying German):

- 1. Years 5 and 6 (ages 9-11): Draw a picture of your ideal *Reiseziel* (travel destination) this destination can be entirely fictional and give your picture 10 explanatory labels. (at least 10 labels, 1 side of A4).
- 2. **Years 7 to 9 (ages 11-14):** Design a visitor's brochure for a German city you'd like to visit. Include photos or drawings and 15 German words or phrases. (must include 15 German words, 1-3 sides of A4)
- 3. Years 10 and 11 (ages 14-16): Create a map of a dream journey (by drawing it or designing a web

- page) that involves three modes of transport. Label each one and 6 of its parts. (at least 15 German words, max. 2 sides of A4).
- 4. Years 12 and 13 (ages 16-18): German loves building words from other words! With the help of a dictionary, create two spider diagrams for words formed from the verbs 'reisen' and 'fahren' (equivalent to a word family such as 'run' → 'runner' 'runny' 'runway' 'forerunner'), providing a translation in brackets under each word. (1 side of A4 for each diagram).
